We are proud to announce that since its inception, the PFIA Scholarship Program has awarded over \$5,000,000 assisting dependent children of our members to subsidize higher education.

In an effort to do more, our Board of Directors has authorized grandchildren and great-grandchildren of members in good standing eligibility. Additionally, applicants who are high school seniors or graduates who plan to enroll or students who are already enrolled in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two- or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school are eligible to apply.

Presently we are limited to awarding 100 scholarships each school year. Our goal is to increase the number of awards in the future, however, we need many more students to apply in order to accomplish this goal.

If a scholarship is not received on the first attempt, applicants are encouraged to apply again the following year. We realize how important education is today to ensure a prosperous future. Please encourage your eligible loved ones to review this brochure in its entirety. Honor us with the opportunity to give them the chance to compete for a valuable PFIA scholarship.

The Police and Firemen's Insurance Association Scholarship Program was established in 1987 to encourage and support higher education.

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances, and an outside appraisal.

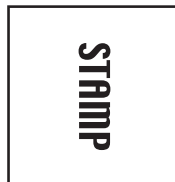
The program is administered by Scholarship Management Services, a division of Scholarship America. Scholarship Management Services is the nation's largest designer and manager of scholarship and tuition reimbursement programs for corporations, foundations, associations and individuals. Awards are granted without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, gender, disability or national origin.

**Eligibility**

- ✓ Applicants must be dependent children\*, grandchildren or great-grandchildren of members in good standing of the Association.
- ✓ Members must hold an insurance policy that has been in effect for at least six months as of May 1.
- ✓ Applicants must also hold a legal reserve insurance policy with the Association.
- ✓ Applicants must be enrolled or planning to enroll as a full-time\*\* undergraduate student in an accredited two- or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school.
- ✓ Applicants must meet all the other criteria of the PFIA Scholarship Program as of May 1.

\* *Dependent children are defined as natural or legally adopted children or stepchildren living in the member's household or primarily supported by the member.*

\*\* *Full-time study is defined as full-time enrollment for the entire upcoming academic year.*

## Scholarship Awards

The Police and Firemen's Insurance Association Scholarship Program awards are \$1,000 for each year of full-time undergraduate study. Awards are offered for tuition and academic fees.

Awards are renewable for up to three years. Recipients must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale as a full-time student. The recipient's policy and the member's policy must remain in force for the duration of the award. *Awards are for undergraduate study only.*

## How To Apply

If you are interested in applying for a PFIA scholarship, please read and carefully follow the instructions below:

**1** Complete the attached card to request a scholarship application form. **Mail the request card to Scholarship Management Services postmarked between March 15 and May 1.** An application will be sent immediately upon receipt of the request card. Cards received prior to March 15 will be held by Scholarship Management Services and an application will be sent in March.

**2** Complete the application and send it along with your high school or college transcripts to Scholarship Management Services. **Scholarship applications must be postmarked no later than May 15.**

Scholarship Management Services's decisions are based solely on the information you provide. Be sure to completely answer each question and to list pertinent extracurricular activities, special recognitions and any unusual personal or family circumstances.

## How Recipients are Selected

Recipients will be selected based upon past academic performance and potential, school and community participation, work experience, career and educational aspirations and goals, unusual personal or family circumstances and an outside appraisal.

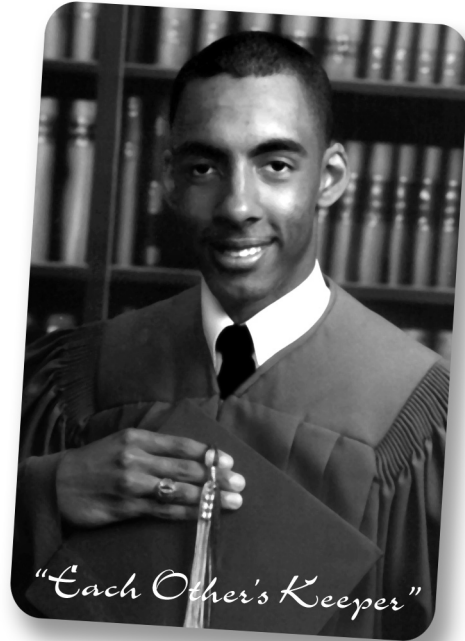
Selection of recipients is made by Scholarship Management Services. In no instance does any officer or employee of PFIA play a part in the selection. All applicants agree to accept the decision as final.

Not every applicant will be a recipient. Students may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements.

Applicants will be notified in early July. The number of scholarships awarded will be based upon Scholarship Management Services selection procedures and on the funds available.

## Scholarship Payment

Scholarship Management Services will pay scholarships in two equal installments. The first



check will be mailed approximately on August 15, and the second will be mailed approximately on December 30. All checks are payable to the school for the student's account. Extenuating circumstances regarding either payment must be sent to Scholarship Management Services in writing.

## Confidentiality

All information received is considered confidential and is reviewed only by Scholarship Management Services.

## Responsibilities, Obligations and Revision Policy

Applicants must gain admission to an accredited two- or four-year college, university or vocational-school and send Scholarship Management Services the information required. No other obligations of any kind will be imposed upon scholarship recipients and no obligation or liability is assumed by PFIA in connection with any scholarship.

The general conditions and procedures under which scholarship awards are made may be reviewed from time to time by PFIA. However, any previously approved scholarship award will not be affected by new conditions or procedures.
